

MELISSA BARRERA: ACTRESS FIRED FROM SCREAM 7 OVER HER **ISRAEL-GAZA POSTS**



The Mexican star was in the cast for Scream 7 but has now been fired by the production company Spyglass, according to Variety magazine.

A spokesperson for Spyglass said the posts were viewed as antisemitic.

They told Variety: "Spyglass' stance is unequivocally clear: We have zero tolerance for antisemitism or the incitement of hate in any form, including false references. to genocide, ethnic cleansing, Holocaust distortion or anything that flagrantly crosses the line into hate speech."

The actress has posted regularly on Instagram about the conflict, the magazine reported she shared a post that accused Israel of "genocide and ethnic cleansing".

Barrera posted a statement on Instagram Stories about her firing, writing: "First and foremost I condemn antisemitism and Islamophobia. I condemn hate and prejudice of any kind against any group of people.

"I believe a group of people are NOT their leadership, and that no governing body should be above criticism.

"I pray day and night for no more deaths, for no more violence, and for peaceful co-existence.

"I will continue to speak out for those that need it most and continue to advocate for peace and safety, for human rights and freedom."

The 33-year-old has starred in the two most recent films in the hit murder mystery and slasher franchise Scream, released in 2022, and Scream 7, which came out earlier this year. She played Sam Carpenter in both movies.

Melissa Barrera is not the only victim of restrictions caused by her standing with Palestine.

Supermodel Bella Hadid, who has long been a vocal supporter of Palestine, raked in some criticism for not speaking about the ongoing Palestine-Israel war. She has finally broken her silence. Bella penned a long note on Instagram, beginning it with an apology for staying silent for so long. "Forgive me for my silence. I have yet to find the ideal words for this deeply intricate and horrific past 2 weeks, weeks that have turned the world's attention back towards a situation that has been taking innocent lives and affecting families for decades. I have much to say, but for today, I will keep it short," she began her note.

Bella also mentioned how she, too, has been impacted by the crisis. "I've been sent hundreds of death threats daily, my phone number has been leaked, and my family has felt to be in danger. But I can not be silenced any longer. Fear is not an option. The people and children of Palestine, especially in Gaza, cannot afford our silence. We are not brave - they are," she wrote.

She also claims she is being silenced by Instagram whenever she posts anything about Palestine.

"My Instagram has disabled me from posting on my story - pretty much only when it is Palestine based I'm going to assume," she said.

"When I post about Palestine, I get immediately shadow banned and almost 1 million less of you see my stories and posts," she told fashion magazine Harper's Bazaar.

Being shadow banned means that your exposure on a given social media platform has been restricted and only you and your direct followers can see your posts, the magazine said.

As in her career, Dior has replaced Bella Hadid with an Israeli model in their latest campaign. This comes after Bella Hadid came out in support of Palestine, said one post with more than 11,000 likes on X, the platform formerly known as Twitter. A hashtag calling to boycott the brand also circulated on the site.



So, what is going on between Israel and Palestine, specifically Gaza, that has such a sensational impact?

Gaza is ruled by Hamas, an Islamist group which is committed to the destruction of Israel and is designated as a terrorist group by the UK and many other countries.

Hamas won the Palestinians' last elections in 2006, and seized control of Gaza the following year by ousting the rival Fatah movement of West Bank-based President Mahmoud Abbas.

Since then, militants in Gaza have fought several wars with Israel, which along with Egypt has maintained a partial blockade on the strip to isolate Hamas and try to stop attacks, particularly the indiscriminate firing of rockets towards Israeli cities.

Palestinians in Gaza say Israel's restrictions and its air strikes on heavily populated areas amount to collective punishment.

This year has been the deadliest year on record for Palestinians in the occupied West Bank and East Jerusalem. They also complain of the restrictions and military actions being carried out there in response to deadly attacks on Israelis.

According to Israeli sources, The Palestinian militant group Hamas launched an unprecedented assault on Israel on 7 October, with hundreds of gunmen infiltrating communities near the Gaza Strip.

About 1,200 people were killed, while the Israeli military says more than 200 soldiers and civilians, including women and children, were taken to Gaza as hostages.

More than 14,000 Palestinians in Gaza have been killed in air and artillery strikes carried out by the Israeli military in response, according to the Hamas-run health ministry in Gaza. The war takes its first break on 24th of November. Qatar, which played an important role in ensuring a temporary ceasefire between the Israeli Army and Hamas, announced that the four-day break in hostilities will begin shortly. The first hostages will be released at 17:00 Turkish time. However, the conflict between two countries are still ongoing and don't seem to end if bigger countries don't take action and remain silent.




Did you know that a group of flamingos is called a "flamboyance"?

HOW THE BILKENT UNIVERSITY WAS FOUNDED BY IHSAN DOĞRAMACI AND WHERE DOES ITS QUALITY COME FROM?

İhsan Doğramacı, born in Erbil, was a prominent Turkish paediatrician and an entrepreneur. Renowned for founding Bilkent University and Hacettepe University, he held key roles globally, including chairman of the UNICEF executive board and president of the Council of Higher Education of Turkey. Fluent in multiple languages, Doğramacı declined political leadership offers, demonstrating a focus on his contributions to education and healthcare. His extensive publications and editorial roles in medical journals reflect his significant impact on the field.

Ihsan Doğramacı has established a company's foundation called as "Bilkent Holding" in 1968 and the companies undergoing restructing such as "Tepe Ağaç Metal" and "Meteksan" assembled under the Holding. This company has been established so as to cater the fundings for Bilkent University.

Establishment of this university traced back to 1940's. İhsan Doğramacı, during his studies in Harvard and Washington Universities, he had a chance to take a closer look at civil society in America and he was affected greatly by this. He aims to draw attention not only from Turkey, but also all around the world and make this university to be counted as the top of the 15 universities among the world. Hence he started to establish the university in 1960's.

So how has Bilkent has been one of the most qualified universities ever?


