History Of Photography

Although the history of photography dates back to ancient times, it has undergone many changes until today. The photograph history came to our day from France in 1830. The basic concept of photography has been a part of our lives since the 5th century BC. Although this development has not taken a photograph, it produces images in the form of reflections. The first permanent images came from France, as we mentioned. Joseph Nicéphore Niépce is a French photographer is the person who enables permanent photographs to be taken. After this development, photography began to develop rapidly. These rapid developments have also been experienced in many other areas. In the 1870s photography took another big step towards the future. Richard Maddox took advantage of previous inventions to make dry gelatin plates that were nearly equal to wet plates in speed and quality. Then there was an even greater development and it became possible for everyone to have a camera in their hands. Until George Eastman founded a company called Kodak in the 1880s, photography was in the hands of professionals and the very wealthy. Thanks to Eastman and its brand Kodak, taking photographs has now become accessible to everyone. By the time of World War I, taking photographs of battlefields and soldiers had become increasingly popular. In addition to the emergence of a line of work such as photojournalism, these reporters were also doing their jobs with these small portable cameras. Smart cameras and the ability to take snapshots emerged towards the end of the 1970s. While these cameras are small like their some previous models, they now provide easier images and reveal them instantly. Automatic cameras have become extremely popular among ordinary photographers. Professionals and committed amateurs continued to make their own adjustments and enjoyed the image control found in SLR cameras. In 1980's and 1990's, It has been tested on cameras from many manufacturers whose data is stored electronically. The first of these was the compact camera, which used digital media instead of film. By 1991 Kodak had produced the first digital camera advanced enough to be used successfully by professionals. Other manufacturers quickly followed suit; today, Canon, Nikon, and Pentax also offer advanced digital cameras. Even the most basic compact camera now takes better quality images than Niépce's tin plate, and smartphones can easily take a high-quality printed photo


Type of photography



NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY

Nature photography is a branch of photography that focuses on natural materials such as landscapes, wildlife, animals, and plants. Nature photographers can raise awareness of the beauty and fragility of the natural world, document the impact of human activities on the environment, provide valuable data for scientific research, and inspire people to become involved in conservation efforts.



The grandfather of landscape photography. He is the one nature photographer that transcends the genre and even photography for that matter. ARCHITECTURAL PHOTOGRAPHY


Architectural photography is the branch of photography that deals with the shooting of architectural structures. In architectural photography, buildings with their own unique beauty are photographed from the outside or inside, reflecting their different features from ordinary buildings. Sometimes architectural shots are taken just for documentation. Architectural photography jobs capture images of buildings and other structures for publication, marketing, or artistic purposes.






Over a period of twenty-five years, Hélène Binet has photographed both contemporary and historical architecture.



FOOD PHOTOGRAPHY


